SUMMARY:

This report is coming forward as a result of direction from the White Valley Parks, Recreation and Culture Advisory Committee, and subsequently the Board of Directors, to have staff prepare and distribute a park planning questionnaire to the residents surrounding Cedar Ridge Park, and bring back results to the White Valley Parks, Recreation and Culture Advisory Committee.

DISCUSSION:

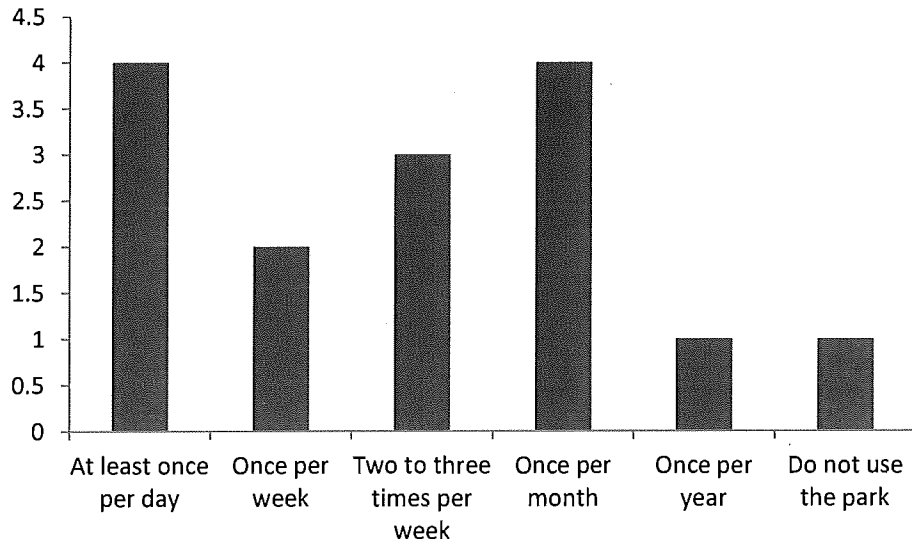
On direction from the Board of Directors, staff prepared and distributed a survey to residents in the surrounding neighbourhoods of Cedar Ridge Park at the end of 2014. The survey (Attachment "A") included questions regarding current park use, park satisfaction, and interest in future park improvements. The survey was distributed by mail to each household, and respondents were given the opportunity to complete the survey on-line, or using the survey form and returning it to the Village of Lumby or RDNO office. Out of the ninety-one (91) surveys that were distributed, only fifteen (15) surveys were returned (16.5%), nine of which came in paper-form and the rest on-line.

Given the reasonably low survey response rate, it is recommended that a neighbourhood meeting be held prior to any significant park improvements being made, although there may be opportunity for some minor improvements that are in-line with the survey feedback that can be done in the shorter term. Some of the key items identified in the feedback include interest in improving play features for children and youth; the opportunity to exercise dogs in the park; additional seating and picnicking amenities (perhaps covered); and maintaining the natural setting that the park provides. The development of the park concept plan should be included in future budget considerations.

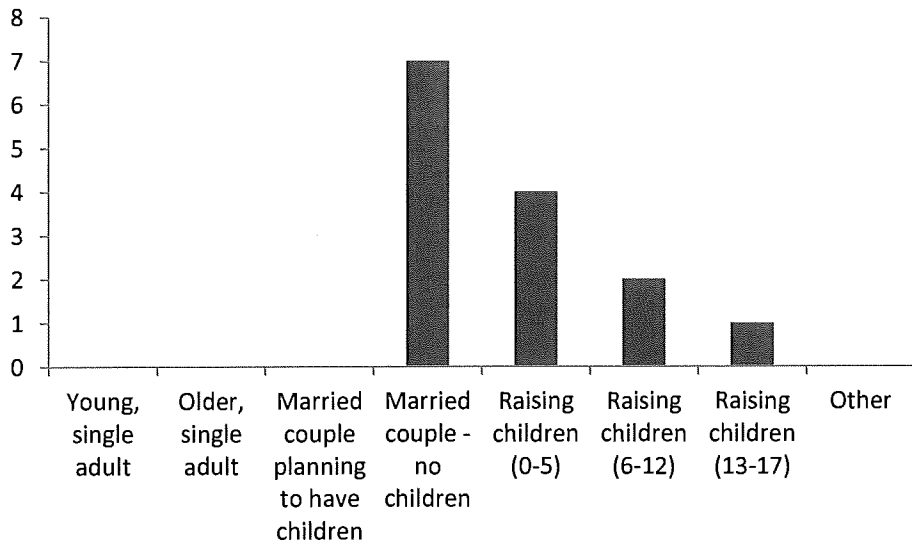

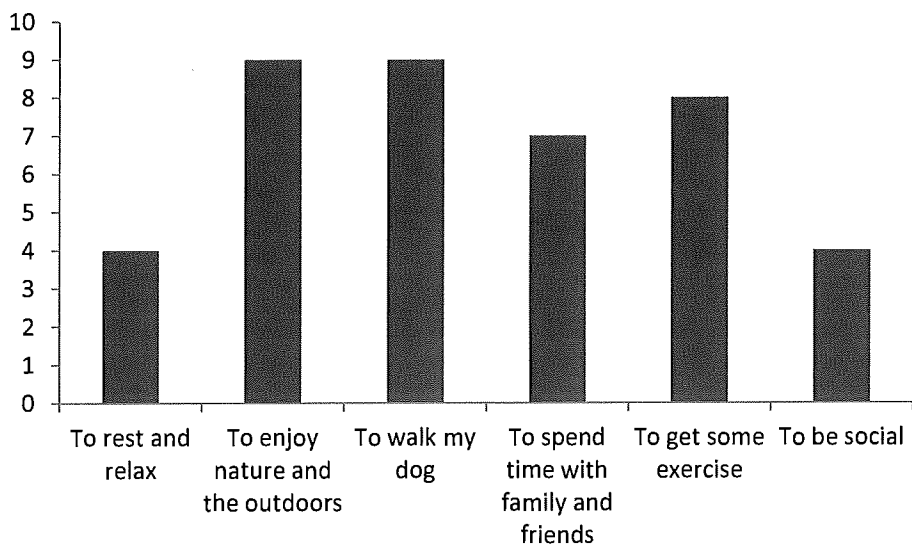
Question 1 - How often do you use/visit Cedar Ridge Park (on average)



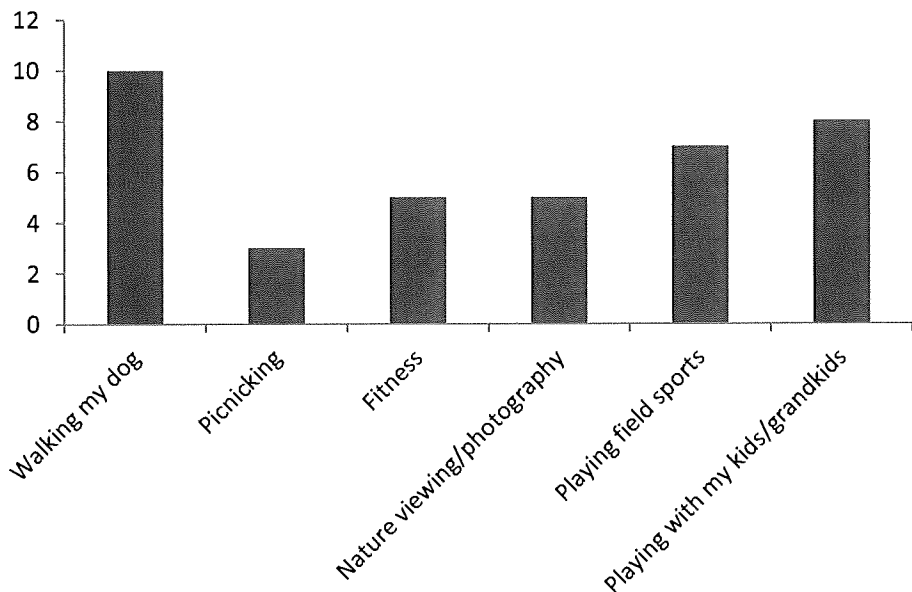
Question 2 - Which best describes your household?



Question 3 - What is your main purpose(s) for visiting Cedar Ridge Park?



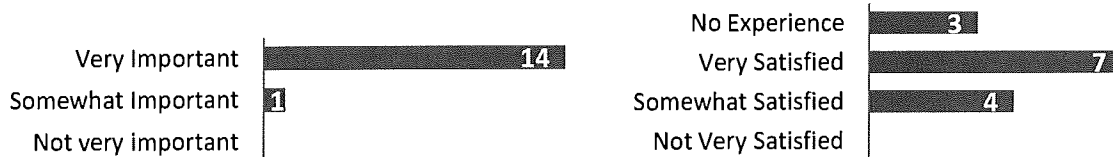
Question 4 - What activities do you most often participate in during your visits to Cedar Ridge Park?

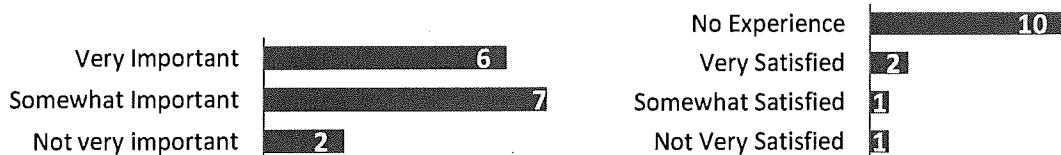

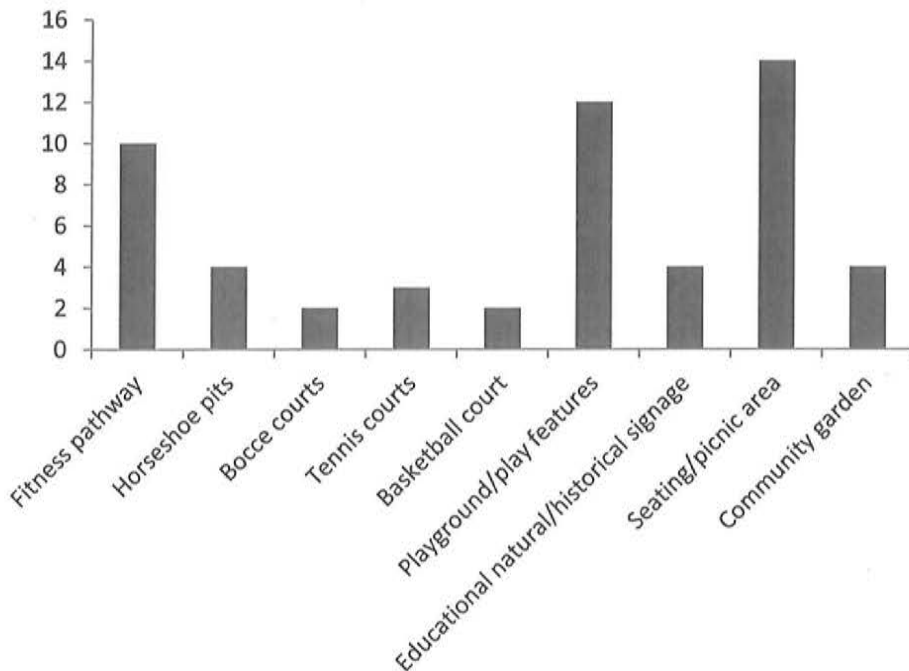

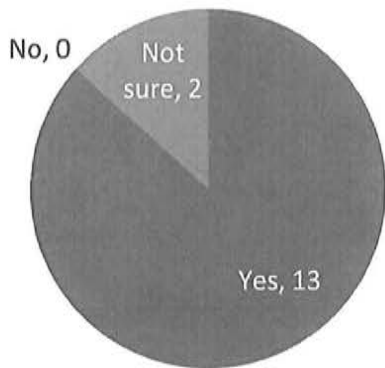

Question 7 - If the above enhancement were made, would you/members of your household use the park more often?



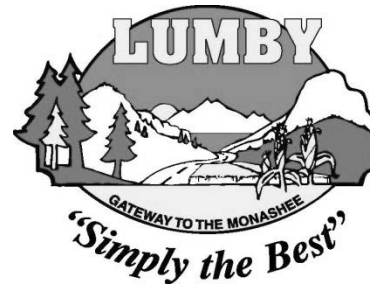

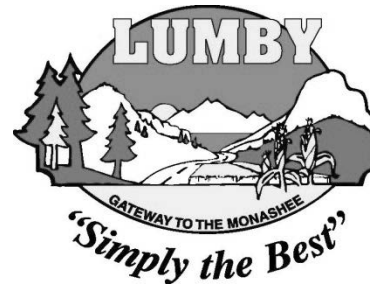

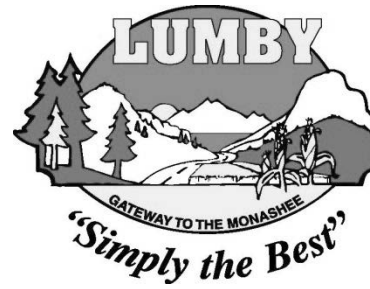

Lumby Family Day Events 2015—Post Event Report

Monday, February 9th was a fun filled, action packed day for Lumby families! We started the morning with a free family skate, which was greatly enjoyed by all who attended. The offer of free skate rentals encouraged a number of residents to try ice skating for their first time.

Events continued at the Community Centre in the afternoon and families were entertained by a variety of stations including: a preschool bouncy castle, inflatable Twister, arts and crafts corner (provided in partnership with Monashee Arts Council) , outdoor snow activities, Zumbatomic demonstrations and children's entertainer Mr. Barrel of Fun . We wrapped up our exciting day with a cake cutting ceremony and free hot chocolate.

Our free family skate was very well attended with upwards of 100 people in the Arena. Arena staff noted that it was the best turn out for skating all season. Events at the Community Centre were similarly well attended with over 70 guests participating in activities. Events were attended not only by residents of Lumby, but also by families in the neighboring communities of Lavington and Cherryville.

The success of our Family Day Event was a direct result of the receipt of the BC Family Day Grant.

Our approval garnered excitement among staff, as we were able to plan this event on a much greater scale than previous events. For example, we would not have been able to afford to bring in such impressive activities, such as the inflatables, as delivery and/or transportation fees are often prohibitive given our rural location. Additionally, our children's entertainer was very well received and his booking would not have been possible without the generous funding from the Province of British Columbia.

In closing, White Valley Parks and Recreation (Village of Lumby) would like to extend our sincere appreciation for receipt of the BC Family Day Grant and would like to impress that without the receipt of these funds, an event of this caliber would not have been possible. It is our hope that this funding may be available in subsequent years so that residents can continue to participate in free, local and family oriented events on BC Family Day.
